

# Minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting of the Florida Association of Aquatic Biologists 36th Annual Meeting Google Meet Virtual Meeting May 4, 2022 - DRAFT

Doug called the meeting to order at 1130.

Approval of the Minutes: The draft minutes from the 2021 EC and Business Meetings were published in the 2022 newsletter in (February) and subsequently approved via email by the EC. Approval was reiterated today.

#### Committees Reports:

Awards: Doug Strom for Rob Mattson, Chair. No current nominations to report.

Bylaws: At last year's annual meeting, Marc Minno resigned as Chair of the Bylaws Committee and Doug volunteered to assume the role. Today, Dana moved for an EC vote to officially place Doug as Chair. The ayes were unanimous. The vote was approved/

Doug distributed copies of the Treasury Reports, EC Membership List and FAB History draft document and promised to send all remote participants electronic copies.

The Marine Taxonomic Workshop netted \$689.51. Our checking account balance as of December 31, 2021, was \$14,592.34. Our Endowment Fund balance as of April 29, 2022, was \$48,891.58. This represents a loss of \$7105.72 since December 31, 2021, due to the recent volatility of the stock market.

Jennifer presented a graph that shows the overall growth of the Endowment Fund despite the recent losses:

Ten people participated, which is lower than normal, but given on-going Covid concerns, attendance level was satisfactory. Another possibility is Jose Leal from the Bailey-Matthews National Shell Museum in Sanibel.

Potential nominees for 2023 are Russ Frydenborg for the Contributions to Florida Aquatic Science and Mark Wetzel for the Contributions to FAB Award. Russ was prominently involved in both the adoption of the Stream Condition Index used in statewide stream bioassessment, as well as other bioassessment indices used in fresh water and in the implementation of Numeric Nutrient Criteria for streams, springs and lakes. Mark Wetzel has helped FAB over many years as "the unofficial FAB archivist", taking abundant photographs of the meetings and related activities, and also serving as FAB's representative to the Society for Freshwater Science and Taxonomic Certification.
