Richard grew up in central Florida, and while working for the Department of Pollution Control as a district biologist, kindled a deep passion for aquatic ecology and especially mayflies. He worked for the State of Florida for almost 39 years as a biologist, wetland expert and director of the south Florida DEP office. He continues to collect mayflies.



This year's workshop will focus on the mayflies. Richard will be giving an overview of the biology and taxonomy of mayflies, and an update on new taxonomic considerations. There will be ample time for lab work to look at specimens and get verifications. Be sure to make plans now to be a part of this great workshop. Due to the size of the teaching lab where we will be meeting, **workshop attendance is limited to thirty (30) persons**, so be sure to register today via the website. <u>Dates/times</u>: The workshop will begin at 1:00 PM on Monday, May 6, and conclude before lunchtime on Wednesday, May 8, 2023.

<u>Location</u>: As with many of our recent freshwater workshops, this one will be held at the excellent teaching laboratory of the University of Florida Department of Entomology and Nematology (Charles Steinmetz Hall) on the UF campus in Gainesville. The address is shown above. When attending the workshop, be sure to park to the **right** of the entrance drive, or behind the building. If you park to the left of the main entrance, you will be ticketed.

Workshop cost: \$70 for FAB members, \$125 for non-members, and \$45 for students

Lodging: A block of 20 rooms has been reserved at the Hampton Inn at 4225 SW 40th Blvd., Gainesville, FL 32608. SW 40th Blvd. is the first road to the right just off I-75 at Archer Road. Rooms are available with two queen beds or one king bed, all non-smoking. A full breakfast is included. There is a 14-day cancellation policy. **The block of rooms will be held until April 16**, but those making reservations after that point might be able to get the discounted FAB rate, pending availability. *Making reservations as soon as possible is recommended*.
